

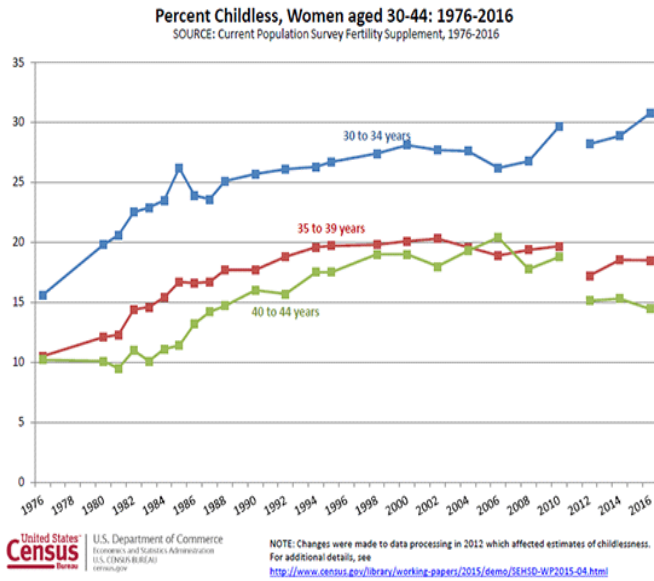

Fertility Trends



In 2016 the U.S. fertility rate hit a record low, and remains below replacement level. Significant shifts in family formation have coincided with and contributed to changes in fertility trends in the United States. The rise in non-marital sexual intercourse, the contraceptive revolution, and decisions to postpone or altogether avoid marriage have resulted in fewer births per a woman and more childless women.
