Effects of Pornography on Marriage



Roughly 55 to 70 percent of men and 30 to 40 percent of women under age 40 reported viewing pornography in a given year. Younger generations of Americans—particularly those who accessed the internet during adolescence—have shown the greatest increase in pornography use over the past few decades. Pornography has harmful and even destructive effects on marriage, and its increased use portends significant social concerns.
